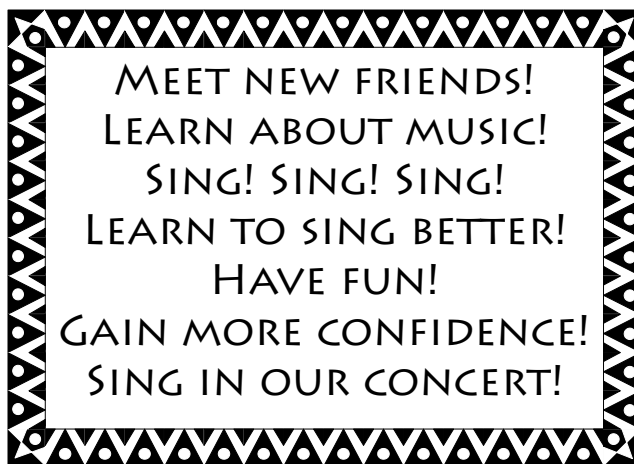

PROGRAM STAFF

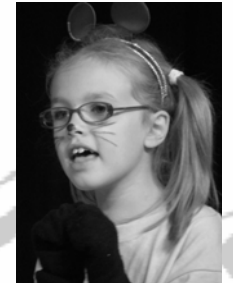

Mrs. Netemeyer earned a degree in Music Education (with an emphasis in piano) from the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana. Currently, she is working towards a certificate in Vocal Pedagogy at Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville. Outside of school, Heather has a small studio of voice and piano students, sings soprano in the Masterworks Chorale, and has been accompanist, adjudicator or clinician for several local contests and festivals.

Ashley Junker is a recent graduate of University of Evansville with a major in Music Education. Ms. Junker served as Music Director at the UE Newman Center and played English Horn with the Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra. While a student at Belleville East, she was a drum major for the marching band and performed as “Belle” in *Beauty and the Beast*. She will begin teaching music at Althoff Catholic High School in the fall.

Dr. Stephen Mager is the Music Director and Conductor of The Masterworks Chorale and Children’s Choruses. Other conducting credits include education outreach performances for Opera Theatre St. Louis and Washington National Opera. An active composer, he holds a Doctor of Music from the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University, where he also completed his Master’s Degree. He is composer-in-residence for Bach Society of St. Louis.
